2021 Honorable Louis Stokes HBCU Scholarship Award Recipient

In April, we began our annual scholarship application process with 333 initiated

applications! The Williams-Franklin Foundation is committed to providing academic scholarships, business/career networking, and mentoring opportunities to HBCU students with extreme financial need. This year, we awarded a total of \$64,000 to 24 WFF scholarship recipients! Our WFF Scholars represent 8 HBCUs, 18 majors, and 16 states. Wisdom Talley is the 2021 Honorable Louis Stokes HBCU Scholarship Award recipient as the top scoring scholar this year.

Congressman Louis Stokes of Ohio funded our Co-Founder, LaShelle Williams-Franklin's, college education at Howard University. Ultimately, this generosity and grace inspired the development of the Williams-Franklin Foundation. This year, we were able to increase the scholarship amount for the Louis Stokes Scholar from \$3,000 to \$6,000! Wisdom Talley, expected class of 2024, is from Elon, North Carolina. She is studying Nursing at Howard University, where she maintained a 4.0 cumulative GPA her freshman year. Wisdom received the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics (NCSSM) Golden Cupola Award for her outstanding academic and leadership achievements. She has experience as a camp counselor and Residential Life Assistant. Wisdom attended the NCSSM Summer Leadership and Research Program where she worked with bacteria, and the Wake Forest Medical Camp. Upon graduating from Howard University, Wisdom plans to become a neonatal nurse practitioner to increase representation in the medical field and decrease alarming Black maternal death rates. We are officially launching our 2021-2022 Mentor Matching Program! The Williams-Franklin Foundation is committed to funding our scholarship recipients' HBCU education, as well as, providing mentorship, professional development, and networking opportunities. The 2018 Gallup Alumni Survey found that "college graduates are almost two times more likely to be engaged at work if they had a mentor who encouraged them to pursue their goals and dreams."

Our Mentor program will foster trusting relationships between WFF Scholars and community members. We intend to pair scholars with mentors sharing similar career interests, experiences and passions. The program aims to develop accountable, nurturing professional connections to help our students succeed professionally and personally.

We are seeking mentors who will:

- Encourage healthy study habits and time management skills;
- Support students achieve their academic and career objectives;
- Assist students with creating a viable professional network;
- Engage students by phone or email once a month;
- Schedule 1-2 activities with student per semester; and
- Commit to being a mentor to a paired WFF Scholar for at least one year.
